Two Nawakwa Brothers Receive Distinguished Service Award

Congratulations are in order for two of SR-7A's finest. It was announced earlier this summer that Will Swingle and John "JT" Thomas (both from Nawakwa Lodge #3) will be presented with the Order of the Arrow's Distinguished Service Award (DSA) this summer at the National Order of the Arrow Conference at Michigan State University.

The DSA was created in 1940 to honor those who render service to the Order beyond the lodge level. The award is presented for distinguished and outstanding

or national basis. Since the time the first awards were presented, less than 840 Distinguished Service Awards have been awarded.

FOR ORDEAL MEMBERS ONLY!

Completing your Ordeal is just the start of the process to seal your membership in the Order of the Arrow. Once you have been in the Order of the Arrow for at least ten months, you are eligible for sealing your membership in the Brotherhood. Don't worry, this isn't another Ordeal.

When you come out to the Fall OA Service Weekend (or the first Service Weekend after you've completed ten months as an Arrowman), you should seal your membership in the Brotherhood. In order to do so, you need to know the signs of the Order of the Arrow which include: The Obligation of the Order, the Order of the Arrow Official Song, the Admonition, sign of the Ordeal, and the handclasp of the Order. You also need to write a letter to the Lodge Secretary explaining your plan for continued cheerful service to others.



Jamboree Shakedown


