2011 Conclave: April 29 – May 1 Hosted by Nawakwa Lodge

Conclave 2011 will be hosted by Nawakwa Lodge #3 at our very own Heart of Virginia Scout Reservation. The dates are April 29 through May 1, 2011. The lodge registration fee is \$50.00, and registration will be completed online. A conclave is where the lodges of the section (Section SR-7A consists of 6 Virginia lodges) get together for training, competition, and fellowship. Of course, the Saturday night block party is a feast that shouldn't be missed. Conclave also gives OA members the opportunity to visit the different camps across the state.

In order to register, please complete the online registration form (see below) and send your \$50 payment to the council office by March 31st. In order to pre-order any of the souvenir items (whether or not you plan to attend the event), please do so on the online registration form and send your payment by February 4th. Late registrations (with an additional late fee) will be accepted online with payment due to the council office by April 15th. Here are the steps for online Conclave registration and souvenir pre-order:

- 1. Point your browser to www.sr7a.oaevent.com. If you created an account in OAEvent for a previous Conclave, you can enter your username and password to log in, then skip to step 6. If you do not remember your previous account details, you may create a new account.
- 2. Select "Sign up for an Account".
- 3. Enter your email address, personal details, select your council, create a user name and password, and click submit.
- 4. You will receive an email confirmation that an account is created.
- 5. Now go back to www.sr7a.oaevent.com and use the account details you created to log into the system to register for Conclave.
- 6. Once logged in, the OAEvent system has the same look and feel as the system that was used for NOAC registrations so the process should be very familiar to those who registered for NOAC online.
- 7. After logging in, select "Register Now" to complete the online registration and select pre-order items. Then print a transmittal form which totals all monies due and mail the transmittal form to your council office along with a medical form. The BSA medical form is available for download on the OAEvent site. Please note that only sections A and C of the medical form are required to attend Conclave. A doctor's signature is not necessary for a participant to attend Conclave.
- 8. Your status will be marked as "Pending" in the system until your Lodge Adviser (or their designee) approves you which will be done after payment is received at your council office.
- 9. When marked approved by your Lodge Adviser (or designee), you will receive an email stating payment has been received and that you are approved to attend Conclave. If your Lodge Adviser (or designee) marks your registration as "Cancelled", you will be considered inactive and will receive an email instructing you to contact your council office for a refund and more details.

2011 Lodge Dues are Due TODAY!!!

If you have not yet paid your 2011 Lodge Dues of \$15, then please do so TODAY!. Dues forms can be found on the lodge web site at http://www.Nawakwa.org/ or at the Council Service Center. Please check your mailing label to see if your dues are current...if 2011 or later appears on your label, then your dues are current...if 2010 or before appears, then your need to pay your dues immediately. Those who don't pay by the end of the year will likely cease to receive mailings from the Lodge.

The Vigil Honor, conferred annually as a national recognition upon OA members, is a high mark of distinction reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions and noteworthy service to others through the OA and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors. The Vigil Honor was first bestowed upon E. Urner Goodman by the Unami Lodge in 1915. Lodges nominate Brotherhood members for the Vigil Honor according to specific national requirements, with nominations limited according to lodge size and a balance between youth and adult members. Those members whose lodges' nominations have been approved by the National OA office are inducted during a special overnight ceremony, and are bestowed with a name of honor translated in both a Native American/American Indian language as well as English. The National OA office issues a Vigil Honor certificate recognizing this honor with the honoree's given name and the Vigil Honor name in both translations.
